CHURCH UPDATE Unfortunately, there has been a stall in the construction. As we were vetting general contractors to finish the job, it was discovered that the infrastructure portion of the project (e.g. the drainage and parking lot/paving) was an incredible cost. Currently, we are researching how to delay the need for the latter so to continue to build the building proper (which is in our budget!). As the cost of materials has increased, we are trying to complete the immediate need (church building) while avoiding undue burdens with the cost of certain materials. Please continue to pray for the success of the project. If you can offer financial assistance, please contact Fr. Boyle as we are still inching towards our goal...we are not there yet! CONVENT UPDATE August 15 th we will bless the new convent with a procession of BVM statue followed by an “open” house for all the faithful. This is a last chance to see the inside before the sisters arrive on the 18 th . Thank you for all who helped on the work day last Wednesday. It was a great spirt of generosity!		
Word Meaning... What exactly is a <i>Cloister?</i> Cloister comes from a Latin word, clausura, meaning “to shut up”. It is an area within a convent to which the religious are normally restricted, or “shut up within”...the sisters are secluded from the world in or as if in a cloister. Religious sisters are able to withdraw from the world, pray, work, and make sacrifices for the good of the Church and the world. Does that differ from a <i>convent?</i> No, it is synonymous with cloister.		
<i>Key Purposes & Functions</i> - Spiritual Contemplation: the enclosed nature of the space, often featuring gardens and fountains, provides sisters a quiet environment for deep meditation and prayer - Central Hub and Passage: this typically includes the church, dining area, dormitories, and chapter house - Symbolism: The four covered sides of the cloister often symbolized the four corners of the earth, while the central garden or fountain represented the Garden of Eden and the ultimate peace of paradise		
<i>Types of cloisters</i> <i>Papal Cloister</i> - This is the strictest level of enclosure. It is usually for convents of nuns dedicated entirely to a life of prayer. Under papal cloister, the nuns stay inside the convent and do not leave. Strangers or outsiders may only enter in very serious emergencies, like medical crises. [N.B we will have “sisters” and not “nuns” ...nuns are strictly contemplative and in a strict cloister.] <i>Constitutional Cloister</i> - This cloister is less strict. It is used by orders that pray but also do outside work, like charity or teaching. The rules for this type of cloister depend on the official rulebook (constitutions) of the specific religious group. It gives members more freedom to leave for their work [but outsiders are not granted more privileges...] <i>Monastic Cloister</i> - This is a more open enclosure. It allows guests to stay at the monastery and interact with the monks or sisters more freely. However, certain private parts of the monastery are still kept separate and private just for the religious community. [i.e. Benedictine Monastery where we can visit certain areas. Here in Warners, there will be certain areas that the workers, clergy, servers, and women can access.]		
<i>Conclusion</i> The above is a general presentation. Here in Warners, the foundation for the SSPX sisters will not resemble the strict (papal) cloister of a contemplative order, as our sisters are semi-contemplative. Yet, respect for their cloister (house / living space) is most important. Our priory is similar to a cloister — regarding who has access. The priory is allowed to be more flexible (as you have noticed). Yet, as we prepare for the sisters, please note that a greater respect is expected. Any questions, please address them to the prior or superior of the convent. We are here to educate the minds and hopefully foster more vocations. May God be glorified!
